President's Corner

This year's Show was special it was our 40th consecutive annual Show (the National Show). A special thank you should go to all those who worked so hard over these many years to make the Midwest Decoy Collectors Association what it is today. As I say to those who ask, our name may say Midwest but we are North American in scope.

It is hard to recognize all those who had a role in this year's Show for fear of leaving someone out. Rose Claussen pitched to help with Registration in addition to organizing the 2nd Collectors Seminar. This has been well received and will be continue to be part of the Show week. Donna Tonelli contributed artwork and articles for the press. Tom O'Key and Tom Bosworth put together a terrific exhibition of Illinois River decoys. This was the 3rd year of this event and will also continue. Next year will feature Michigan decoys. Jim Wierzba and his crew of helpers once again had events running smoothly at the Exhibition Hall. A special buffet was offered for the first time on Friday evening after the Show closed for the day. Two hundred fifty three (253) members took advantage of this opportunity. It was not well publicized since we only reached agreement with Pheasant Run the week before to offer the buffet. I expect more to attend next year.

I frequently am asked to provide statistics about the Show. So here we go!

There were 314 members staying at Pheasant Run during the week. They stayed 1103 nights for an average of 3.5 nights per member. There were 360 tables occupied in the Exhibition Hall. Fifty three (53) new members joined and fifteen

(15) former members rejoined. We are now at the highest membership level we have ever experienced at this time of year (1,007). We typically are just under or over 900 at the end of the Show.

Our contract with Pheasant Run expired as of this year's Show. A new three year contract has been negotiated that is more favorable to our members. The current room rate was \$105 per night plus a \$5 amenities fee and tax.

The rate for the next three years will be \$109 and the elimination of the \$5 amenities fee. This applies to the Courtyard and Golf wing rooms. The Tower rooms have been extensively remodeled and will increase to \$119 for 2006 and \$129 for 2007 & 2008. Double occupancy is unchanged at an additional \$10 per night. We will also negotiate a lower rate for Courtyard by Marriott which is across the street for those looking for a less expensive alternative.

The Board of Directors met on Thursday morning prior to the Show. Randy Root and Dick Brust did not run for re-election. Tom Bosworth and Ken Cole were elected to replace them. Our congratulations to Tom and Ken. We look forward to working with them. The absence of Dick and Randy on the Board is a milestone. Randy was elected to the original Board in 1973 and has served since that time. Dick came aboard in 1989. We all owe Dick and Randy our thanks for a lot of hard work. Please thank them the next time you see them. Dick will continue to work with the Board in the role of Historian and mentor.

That's all for now. I hope you all have a great summer.
