Association is a nonprofit, educational organization incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois. It invites membership to all persons. The purpose of North American Decoy Collectors is to foster the hobby of decoy collecting by attracting new collectors, seeking out and preserving old decoys, gathering data about carvers and their methods, and holding an annual show for decoy collectors and carvers.

OUR HISTORY

The North American Decoy Collectors

Association was started in 1966 by a small group of dedicated decoy collectors as a gathering in Ottawa, Illinois to reconnect, share stories and trade decoys. Since then, the Club has grown to nearly 800 enthusiasts from all over North America and from all walks of life. They write books on collecting, manage auction companies, publish collector magazines, carve world class decoys, calls and collectibles, provide appraisal services, and form a core network of knowledge on sporting collectibles and their history. That humble gathering of collectors in 1966 has grown to become the North American Vintage Decoy and Sporting Collectibles Show - the largest show of its kind. The annual show features room-to-room trading, a tabled show and a major decoy auction in addition to a variety of networking events and educational activities including seminars, displays and carving demonstrations.

We are very pleased with the progress made at our 2022 show after two COVIDdriven cancellations. It gives us an excellent base from which to springboard into 2023. Old friends have the confidence to return. Many are updating and refreshing their collections. We are gaining new members monthly. Those trends allow us to create a memorable and fun experience in 2023.

We are building a new website, and the first phase is operational. There are two essential capabilities to explore. First, you can pay your dues online with a credit card and a large number of members have already renewed their membership online. A mail-in form is also available if that is still your preference. Second, the hotel booking link is easy to use to confirm your show plans. The first 65 rooms and 180 room nights are already committed, and the room numbers are assigned.

We are returning to our previous weekly agenda flow. This allowed us to realign the hotel agreement, and I am pleased that we will enjoy attractive event pricing. The hotel has completed its remodeling project, and all rooms have been upgraded. We anticipate occupying 250 rooms, approaching 900 total room nights this year. Use the booking link, as it is the most effective way to manage your room reservations. If you choose to call, you go through the Marriott reservation center, which routes worldwide based on call volume and capacity availability. If you have any issues, please get in touch with me so I can engage our customer support team.

Our prime selling floors are from two through six. We expect to fill all of the rooms on those floors quickly. I am busy building a comprehensive room layout and reaching out to everyone to understand your goals to create the best possible plan. Please make your reservations as soon as possible.

The demand for ballroom show space is accelerating as we already have commitments for over 150 tables. Matt Bryant plays a vital role in designing each year's show plan, navigating a wide range of complex requirements. Please finalize your plans and communicate your needs as soon as possible.

One key objective for our organization is to help our members become wellinformed collectors. We do that in many ways. This year, we will feature seminars on Lake St. Clair fish, Sibley, and Lake Koshkonong decoys. You will be pleased with the depth of knowledge available on these subjects.

We are grateful that Herb and Carolynn Desch have chosen to sell the best of their collection through Guyette & Deeter during our event. I have spent many hours discussing decoys with Herb and helped him acquire many of these treasures. I know you will enjoy seeing them as most have never been available to the public.

The Callmakers and Collectors group deserves your attention and support at the show as they share their passion with us each year. Their work is stunning.

I'm delighted that Kurt Woodworth is joining the Board and will help us focus on member development and retention. It is gratifying to see Kurt and Matt Bryant continuing their fathers' exceptional legacy and passion for sporting collectibles. They both bring great backgrounds to our organization as they grew up attending our events.

Randy Root has been elected Director Emeritus and served on the Board almost from the Club's beginning. I am grateful for his continued support. He also helps the Peoria Museum as they celebrate the decoy and its unique place in American history.



Membership Is as Strong as Ever




The Club continues to add new members and our membership roster has now exceeded the pre-COVID highs. This certainly


Facebook Group Continues to Grow





Member Display and Seminar

The Decoys of Lake Koshkonong








This year's Member Display and accompanying seminar will tell the fascinating story of Lake Koshkonong's Golden Era (1848-1906). Once referred to as the "Chesapeake of the West" by early hunters, this area was frequented by market hunters, wealthy industrialists, politicians, military men and outdoors writers who came in pursuit of the clouds of canvasbacks that came to feed on the lake's abundant wild aquatic celery.

DISPLAY: Available for viewing in the Grand Ballroom on Friday and Saturday, this special display will illustrate the unique features of these early decoys, including their evolution from birds that bore striking similarities to those hunted on the Susquehanna Flats to the later "Hotel Style" birds with their more swept back heads and carrying hotel or club brands. Other related items from this era will also be on display.

SEMINAR: On Thursday afternoon, NADCA Board Member and Koshkonong historian Al Steffen will present the history of this once rich waterfowling area. Al has written several articles on "Kosh" decoys and the many theories on how they came to be. He will discuss the colorful history of the area and the men who came en masse to hunt the canvasbacks in the late 1880's. He will also talk about the many hunt clubs and hotels that emerged on the shores of the lake to accommodate the many who came to the area to take advantage of its superior hunting. The story of these rare decoys is indeed a complex and still somewhat mysterious one. This seminar is sure to be an educational experience for us all.

Educational Seminars:

Lake St. Clair Fish Decoy Seminar

Connecting Michigan's Lake Huron to the north and Lake Erie to the south, Lake St. Clair has long been one of the most active and productive spear fishing locations in the Midwest. As a result, the quantity and quality of decoys used by early fishermen on the lake is simply remarkable.

On Wednesday morning, Jon Deeter, principal of the Guyette & Deeter auction house, will present, "The Fabulous Fish Decoys Made and Used on Lake St. Clair." He will focus on the decoys made by important makers such as Hans Janner, Andy Trombley, Horace "Bart" Perkins, Abraham DeHate, Jim Rosen, Charles Kellman and others. These craftsmen demonstrated creativity and ingenuity that resulted in some of today's most sought after fish spearing decoys. Some of the finest examples known will be on hand for attendees to examine.

In addition, Jon will regale the crowd with stories about some of the early pickers such as Jerry Catana, Ed Denavare, Charlie Hart, and Jerry Adams – men who were on the forefront of discovering many of the best examples of these exquisite fish.

Given the recent high prices brought by some of these decoys, you won't want to miss this important seminar.



Educational Seminars:

Sibley Decoy Display & Seminar

For many years the Sibley decoy was attributed to a "Mr. X," a moniker given to these unique birds by early collector Joe French in the 1950s. The only decoy known to be made with a hardwood inserted bill, the Sibley decoys were eventually found to have been manufactured by Sibley & Co. of Whitehall, Michigan. Production began in 1899 and continued for about a decade.

SEMINAR: On Thursday morning prior to the opening of the ballroom event, Sibley collector/historian Bob Poel, along with Stan Van Etten, will share the fascinating history of these decoys that will no doubt come as an exciting and unique surprise to even the longtime collector in the audience. Along with a fascinating discussion of these decoys and their characteristics, the duo will talk about the hunting experiences of the Sibley brothers, George and John.

DISPLAY: Complementing the seminar, Poel and Van Etten will host an expansive display of these rare decoys and answer questions from show attendees on both Friday and Saturday in the Grand Ballroom. The display will feature decoys from Sibley's personal rig, X-rays of Sibley decoy interiors and hollowing techniques, as well as various techniques used to insert the bills.

Be sure to take advantage of this opportunity to learn about these once "unknown" decoys.

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

This year, the auction related events return to their traditional days beginning with the Preview Reception on Wednesday evening from 5-7pm.



These popular demonstrations represent a great learning opportunity for fledgling decoy makers and anyone with an interest in understanding how decoys are made.

MEMBER PROFILE: Jon Sarver Love of waterfowling History Runs deep

For Illinois native Jon Sarver growing up on the banks of the Illinois River in Chillicothe meant that duck hunting was just a way of life.



He fondly recalls the thrill of watching thousands of ducks flock out in the nearby cornfields in the fall. He enjoyed that the waterfowl scene around town was always active. He estimates that 60% of the folks who lived there were duck hunters and it seemed like just about everybody had a decoy or two around the house. With rapt attention he would listen to old timers tell stories of epic hunts while some spoke of finding decoys in the frozen ice along the river, kicking their heads off and chipping the bodies out to use for firewood. Simply put, it's no surprise that Jon is so connected to the waterfowling life in this area and its long, colorful history that is filled with so many great characters. And it's certainly no surprise that he surrounds himself with so many tools of the waterfowling trade to this day.

Collecting Begins

Like so many of us, Jon's collecting began rather modestly. Around 20 years of age, he happened to visit a local banker and was surprised and excited to find a display of old decoys in his office. This rekindled so many

memories from his childhood that he just knew that he had to have a decoy of his own. It wasn't long before he acquired his first decoy -- an old Victor mallard that he found at a local garage sale. He recalls thinking, "Decoys are just the coolest things!" He was fascinated that these old things were floated on the backwaters of the Illinois River...right in his own backyard! Over the decade that followed he bought a few more birds here and there, but without much direction or focus. However, the seeds had been planted for what would become a passion for collecting not just decoys but almost anything related to waterfowling and its history.

Learning the Ropes

Jon got serious about collecting in his late 20's. By then, he had a bit more time and resources to devote to the pursuit but he knew that he had to learn a lot more If he was going to get into the hobby in a more meaningful way. He quickly began immersing himself in anything he could find that was written about decoys. He claims to have read "Decoys of the Illinois River" front to back at least five times!

During the same period, he started going to shows, beginning with the Henry Show in the early 1990s, where he met Joe Tonelli, long-time collector, historian, and one of the founders of what is today the North American Decoy Collectors Association. Jon says that it was Joe who had the biggest influence on his collecting, mentoring Jon along the way through visits to Joe's expansive collection of waterfowling artifacts, and through occasional trips to Tonelli's hunting camp in South Dakota where they would spend hours talking about decoys.

Not long after, Jon met Randy Root while working as a vet tech at a veterinarian's office in Peoria. He soon learned that Randy was into decoys and had a thriving hunt club. He was later able to visit Randy, examine his collection and significantly add to his decoy education. Since then he has been able to enjoy visits with many other collectors who have willingly shared their collections and their knowledge. Among them are NADCA members Dave Kneebone, Pat Gregory, Gary Fountain, and Mike Lashbrook.

Jon has since parlayed his relationship with Pat Gregory into a passion for carving decoys as well. About four years ago he began taking decoy making lessons from Pat. Along with his wife, Amy, an accomplished painter who was mentored by Mike Lashbrook, the

couple has beautifully restored a number of classic Illinois River decoys including a wonderful sleeper Mallard hen carved by Charles Perdew. The team has already become a "go-to" restoration source for many collectors in the Midwest.

Decoy Collecting

Not surprisingly, Jon initially focused on collecting decoys from the Illinois River area given his frequent exposure to and familiarity with decoys from the region. His collection boasts fine examples from many of the Illinois River's most accomplished makers including Virgil Lashbrook, Mario Pioletti, Charles Schoenheider, Robert Elliston, Lane school, as well as a very early Canvasback made by

However, over time his regular attendance at shows in the Midwest (Chicago, Henry, Utica), as well as Easton on the east coast, have had a significant influence on broadening his collecting interests. Today, his collection includes fine examples by Canadians George Warin and Tory Ward, Wisconsin folk artists Gus Moak and Frank Resop, as well as east coast makers such as Elmer Crowell and the Ward Brothers. Jon has a particular affinity for a Ward Brothers miniature goose in his collection. It is signed and dated 1965, the year he was born. His shelves are also graced by the work of a number of today's finest contemporary decoy makers, including Marty Hanson, Cameron McIntyre, Josh Brewer, and R.D. Wilson.

Among all of his birds, Jon says that his "favorite" is a 1969 Canvasback by the Ward Brothers. He has become a big fan of their work and the poem written on the bottom of this Can handwritten by Lem Ward makes it very special to him. He is quick to add that he is always looking to add more Wards to his shelves.

Collecting Waterfowling History

Jon's interest in sporting collectibles goes well beyond waterfowl decoys. His home is filled with a variety of artifacts that represent the rich history of waterfowling in America. Around every corner visitors will find any number of shot shell boxes, gunning boxes, fish decoys, sporting art, and an old gunning skiffs. He also owns a number of patterns used by various Illinois River decoy makers including a pattern employed by Charles Schoenheider for his iconic standing geese.

Jon smiles as he tells the story of acquiring a beautifully made skiff from Wisconsin that he found in a barn sitting under a roost frequented by many local pigeons. He admits to frequently pestering the owner to sell it, repeatedly asking how long he planned to let that pigeon "poop" pile up on the worn, old relic. Eventually the owner relented and Jon was able to restore it and hang in his living room filled with his favorite decoys from Wisconsin. It makes for a stunning display!


Coincidentally, this same owner later connected Jon to another



Wisconsin collector who was ready to part with some fish decoys. The owner was a professor at the University of Wisconsin for many years and was an artist as well. Jon jokes that this guy was just "a little different." He had apparently made it a habit to visit local bars on the morning of the opening day of the sturgeon season to drink beer and try to buy as many "coaxers" as he could from local fishermen. When Jon went to his house to look at the fish, he found almost 250 fish decoys on the owner's living room floor carefully arranged in a circle as though they were swimming. Some were 4-5 feet long! The owner would only sell them as a single lot, but Jon was determined. Despite the owner's eccentricities, Jon was able to buy the group which included a number of really folky unknowns as well as some good Leroy Howell fish.

Supporting Our Hobby

Fortunately for all of us, Jon has long been much more than a collector of these treasures. He's long been a great advocate for the hobby we all so enjoy. In 2003 he started the Chillicothe (IL) Decoy Show and ran it until 2008 when a busy life with kids and work eventually made continuing impossible. This show eventually became NADCA Board member Dave Kneebone's show now located in Utica, Illinois. The good news is that Jon is now getting back in the event game. He recently took over the Henry Show and just had his first event in early February. He hopes to grow it back to its hey day when nearly 1000 local enthusiasts came through the door.
