Association is a nonprofit, educational organization incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois. It invites membership to all persons. The purpose of North American Decoy Collectors is to foster the hobby of decoy collecting by attracting new collectors, seeking out and preserving old decoys, gathering data about carvers and their methods, and holding an annual show for decoy collectors and carvers.

#### **OUR HISTORY**

The North American Decoy Collectors Association was started in 1966 by a small group of dedicated decoy collectors as a gathering in Ottawa, Illinois to reconnect, share stories and trade decoys. Since then, the Club has grown to nearly 800 enthusiasts from all over North America and from all walks of life. They write books on collecting, manage auction companies, publish collector magazines, carve world class decoys, calls and collectibles, provide appraisal services, and form a core network of knowledge on sporting collectibles and their history. That humble gathering of collectors in 1966 has grown to become the North American Vintage Decoy and Sporting Collectibles Show - the largest show of its kind. The annual show features room-to-room trading, a tabled show and a major decoy auction in addition to a variety of networking events and educational activities including seminars, displays and carving demonstrations.

Please renew your membership and help support our work. It's easy and a great value. Make your plans to attend the show and book your reservations. Bring some good things to share and sell. It helps all of us.




## 2024 Member Directory to Mail Before Show






### **An Ideal Location**

# Detroit's Original "Big Three"

This year's Member Display will celebrate Detroit's original "Big Three" decoy makers -- George Petersen, Jasper N. Dodge, and William J. Mason. This pioneering trio of early decoy manufacturers produced thousands of working waterfowl decoys from the late 1800s to the mid-1920s.

The display will feature examples of drake mallard decoys by Petersen, Dodge, and Mason. Attendees will see prime examples of these three decoy makers, side-by-side, highlighting both the similarities and differences in their birds. For many years, there has been a good deal of confusion among the three factories' output. This display will help clarify the distinctive characteristics for each maker. There will also be decoys that represent the unusual "collaboration" between the Dodge and Mason factories, from the time when both were in operation and cooperated to keep up with seasonal demand, particularly from mass merchants such as Sears and Montgomery Ward catalog businesses.

Board member Bill Dodge is finalizing plans for this unique display. He has been collecting these decoys for over 40 years and is co-author of the reference book, "Detroit Decoy Dynasty: The Factory Decoys of Petersen, Dodge, and Mason." This is sure to be a wonderful and educational display, available in the Grand Ballroom on Friday and Saturday.

## **Educational Seminar:**

# The Haid's: A Collecting Journey

This year's seminar is a very special one. It will tell the story of how Alan and Elaine Haid acquired their iconic collection. The Haids started their collecting journey together in 1967 and acquired the rarest and finest examples of waterfowl decoys they could find, always working to improve and refine their collection over the decades. As Alan's knowledge and influence grew, he would become a successful dealer and appraiser of decoys and would author 'Decoys of the Mississippi Flyway' in 1981 and co-author 'Mason Decoys – A Complete Pictorial Guide' in 1993. The result of that amount of focus and time spent in one collecting field is a grouping of some of the rarest examples by many of the top artists from America.

Jon Deeter, principal at Guyette & Deeter, and Joe Tonelli, legendary collector and friend of the Haids since their early days of collecting, will discuss the fascinating path taken by this couple in acquiring one of the finest collections of waterfowl decoys ever assembled. The presentation will feature an early videotaped interview with the Haids in their Connecticut home discussing key pieces in their collection. Tonelli, who helped the Haids find a number of pieces over the years, will share great stories of how this savvy couple managed to purchase so many iconic pieces, often on a budget.

This seminar will take place on Wednesday at 9am and promises to be both highly entertaining and informative. The strategies employed by the Haids will no doubt benefit every collector fortunate enough to attend.

# Wisconsin Gunning Box Display Returns



During the past several years, show attendees have marveled at the ingenuity demonstrated by early Wisconsin hunters of the past. This year attendees at the Friday and Saturday event in the Grand Ballroom will be treated to yet another group of classic Lake Poygan (WI) gunning boxes. These unique, multi- purpose, wooden "totes" were tools of the Wisconsin hunting trade that allowed these early waterfowlers to more easily transport and organize everything they needed for a successful hunt. These boxes represent the epitome of creativity in their design as they often provided a cradle for a gun as well as multiple cubbies for housing all sorts of hunting paraphernalia. Attendees are encouraged to spend some time closely examining these boxes as each one is unique in its design and utility.

# Member Decoy Contest Mergansers Take Center Stage

Each year, we hold a species-specific decoy contest, allowing members to share some of their favorite decoys in their collections. This year's contest will feature Mergansers. "Sawbills," "Fish Ducks," "Hairy Heads" -- whatever you call them, this promises to be an exciting assembly of great examples of Common, Red-Breasted and Hooded Mergansers.

Once again, we will conduct two separate contests one for vintage Merganser decoys and one for contemporary Mergansers. Members should start planning for which decoys they want to enter – one entry in both the vintage and contemporary categories is allowed. Pairs count as a single entry. This Saturday competition is sure to generate a lot of interest among all show attendees as all contest entries will be on display throughout the day on Saturday in the Grand Ballroom.








### CONTEMPORARY TALENT ON DISPLAY





# MEMBER PROFILE: Josh Brewer: Decoy maker returns to fulltime carving



Forty-one year old Josh Brewer may not be the first name that comes to mind just yet when one thinks about today's top contemporary decoy makers. Then again, none of the others took a break from carving to practice medicine for 10 years in the middle of their carving career. That said, his is a story of passion for the outdoors, love of working with his hands, and a desire to help others.

### **The Artist**

Josh grew up near the Chesapeake Bay and was never far from the fertile hunting grounds where his father taught him to hunt ducks at an early age. In addition to being an avid duck hunter, his father was a wood worker, making reproduction antique furniture and building houses with "old-world" workmanship. Josh relished the

time he would spend with his dad in the shop, and jumped at the opportunity when his father suggested he make a decoy for their next hunt. It was this first ruddy duck, made with his dad's hand tools, that was the inspiration for a life devoted to artistic expression in wood.

### **Honing His Skills**

By his 13th birthday, Josh left many modern pursuits behind, sold his video games and used the proceeds to buy carving knives. He worked tirelessly to develop his carving skills every afternoon, taking advantage of the free time that came from being homeschooled. He is basically a selftaught carver. He firmly believes that learning skills like this as a kid, without the self-pressure or self-doubt that so often comes with adulthood, has been the key to acquiring the great talent he exhibits today.

Early on, Josh had an affinity for old decoys which greatly influenced his future work. He gives much credit to Ward Museum pioneer, curator and conservationist Sam Dyke, who took Josh under his wing and taught him a great deal about old decoys. In high school he would spend every Friday afternoon at the nearby museum examining and sketching old decoys, striving to understand how they were constructed, carved and painted. Opportunities like this were critical in these early days before the internet was widely available, eventually providing access to any decoy one might want to study. However, despite the instant access to photos today, Josh still insists that examining a bird in hand is the best way to learn since photos don't reveal the subtleties of carving and painting techniques used by the past masters. In particular, Josh believes that carving skills can be developed relatively fast,

while learning to paint is often a much slower process. By relentlessly studying the old masters, he was able to develop and expand his abilities as an oil painter in his teens.

Josh is quick to point to a number of others who influenced his work along the way. These include local carvers and decoy makers – Grayson Chesser, Bobby Swain, Rich Smoker, Arthur Leonard, Oliver Lawson and more. He also credits the work of carvers who had gone before, seen through reference books by the likes of Henry Fleckenstein, Joe Engers, and Dr. George Ross Starr and others. Josh jokes that his copy of Engers' book, "The Great Book of Wildfowl Decoys,"

has so many wood chips and paint splatters in it that the pages barely turn any more. Indeed, he feels a great debt to the writers, collectors and historians who document the decoy through history.

With the help and influence of these men and more, Josh was carving full-time and exhibiting at shows around the country by the time he graduated from high school at just 17 years old.

### **A Life Transition**

Josh graduated from college as a pre-med student by the time he turned 20. While he had planned to pursue a career in medicine after college, the pull of his first love was too powerful. With a couple year's worth of back orders in hand, he decided to rededicate his life to carving full time. He did so successfully until 2011. The economic downturn and the responsibilities of his upcoming marriage caused Josh to reconsider a career in medicine, his other lifelong interest. Beginning with medical school in West Virginia, this new journey led him to practice family medicine, first on the Eastern Shore of Maryland and Tangier Island in Chesapeake, and later on the Blue Hill Peninsula in Maine. During this time, he would subjugate carving to focus on a growing family and his new profession, serving those in need.

However, after practicing medicine for over 12 years, Josh once again felt the tug of artistic endeavors that had been so central to his life from an early age. Life in Maine provided him with new sources of inspiration and reconnected him with a rich tradition of craftsmanship and art. In 2022, Josh decided to leave medicine and return

to carving full-time, fueled by a desire to spend more time with his wife, instill traditional values in his two young sons, and the joy of working with his hands.

### **The Work**

Josh describes his work as a blending of his love of history, old decoys and waterfowling. Specifically, he says that he sees his birds as an amalgam of realism and traditional craftsmanship by employing the same techniques used by the early masters. His early work focused on waterfowl decoys. However, after being introduced to, and falling in love with hunting upland birds, Josh's work expanded to include woodcock, quail, grouse and pheasants. As Josh puts it, "The opportunity to observe these birds in their natural environment and study the specimens greatly enhanced my work." In all of this work, Josh has always remained enamored with the traditional decoy as true folk art rooted in function.

Today, Josh's talent is expressed through duck decoys, wall hangings, miniatures, and a variety of other bird carvings. Throughout his carving career, he has sought inspiration in the work of early artists. All of his work reflects the years of studying the work of early decoy makers and artists from the east. His decorative and gunning birds are made using traditional hand-carving techniques. His early flyers were inspired by the work of the Ward Brothers, Elmer Crowell, and Chauncey Wheeler. And his dead mount carvings clearly owe their form to the art of early painter Alexander Pope.

Josh credits his time as a doctor with having a significant impact on his most recent work. He believes his current work is more nuanced and detailed which he attributes to the precision required in the medical profession. The first piece he made after returning to full-time carving was a ring-neck pheasant flyer which he views as being significantly more refined in both paint and form.

Another post-medicine piece of which he is particularly proud is a hanging Osprey that challenged him at every phase. The sketch did not come easy, with multiple attempts to capture his vision for the carving. Ultimately, the composition came to life on a paper napkin reflecting precisely what he had in his mind. This critical step resulted in a carving exactly what he had intended.

Shortly thereafter, at the urging of his father, he made an impressive preening pintail in advance of the 2022 North American Decoy & Sporting Collectors Show. He keeps it as a constant reminder of his dad, who passed shortly before the show.

### **The Collector**

Josh is clearly a man of many interests. In addition to his carving life, his deep appreciation of traditional craftmanship has also led him to collect works of early makers as well. His first collecting experience came at an early age when he acquired a small rig of old cork black ducks used by the father of a local hunter in Vienna, Maryland. Shortly thereafter he got very excited about this group when he discovered that they were pictured in Henry Fleckenstein's book, "Decoys of the Mid-Atlantic Region."

He describes his interest in old decoys as relatively eclectic, collecting items of interest that he is drawn to as a maker and artist. Form and essence of the species as well as craftsmanship in the details interest him most. His waterfowl collection includes a broad range of pieces including hollow black ducks from the Mid Atlantic, a Ward Brothers preening black duck, and, in particular, a Gus Wilson Scoter. As a decoy maker he says that he appreciates the complex sculptural form of Wilson's work. Other birds in his collection include a mixture of carvings by unknown and wellknown makers. Among these are a pair of mallards by Tuts Lawson, a beautiful Chesapeake Bay swan,

and turtleback scoters and eiders from the Maritimes. He also has a number of miniatures by Rhode Island's A.J. King and Robert Morse of Maine.

In addition to decoys, Josh also collects etchings and old tools. His artwork includes illustrations of pintails, black ducks and shorebirds, dove, quail and woodcock by early artists Frank Benson and Isabel Bishop, as well as modern etching master Brett James Smith. His tool collecting is as much a practical pursuit as it is admiration for the skilled craftsman of old. He clearly takes great joy in using many of the planes, English gouges, spokeshaves and drawknives he has acquired, and sees their continued relevance imprinted in his daily work.

### **Looking Ahead**

As Josh reflects on collecting and his own carving, he expresses it this way, "What attracts me to any piece is not just form, but the form and shape of paint patterns and how they mix with the sculpture. Add 'surface' and it's what I strive for in both creating and collecting." Josh adds, "I love the idea that sooner or later these new creations will be antiques in their own right, and I hope to make them in a way that weathers the arc of time with the ability to still inspire the viewer."


